<p>By the end of this training session, participants will be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Illustrate how WebQuests can be used in a youth work setting 2. Create a WebQuest on a topic of importance to a youth worker.

5-minutes	<p>Overview of the Learning Outcomes</p> <p>The facilitator will present the learning outcomes and expectations for module five of the Connect Project.</p>	Module Five PowerPoint Slides 1 – 3
10-minutes	<p>What is a WebQuest?</p> <p>The facilitator will ask a series of questions to the group, to gauge their understanding of WebQuests, inquiry-based learning and constructivism.</p> <p>The content on slide 5 will be presented and discussed amongst the group.</p>	Module Five PowerPoint Slide 4 – 5
15-minutes	<p>Using WebQuests in a Youth Setting</p> <p>The facilitator will initially explore with the youth workers opportunities for project-based and inquiry-based learning in their youth practice.</p> <p>Youth workers will be invited to reflect on their caseload and consider where they have used project or inquiry-based learning in the past. They will briefly discuss these opportunities with the group for peer-to-peer learning.</p> <p>The content of slide 7 will be presented and examples</p>	Module Five PowerPoint Slide 6 – 7

25-minutes	<p>The structure of a WebQuest</p> <p>The facilitator should provide the group with either a digital version of one of the WebQuests from the Connect Project, or, provide them with a printed copy for reference.</p> <p>The facilitator will present and demonstrate the content on slides 8 – 13 whilst referring to the exemplar WebQuest provided.</p>	Module Five PowerPoint Slide 8 – 13
5-minutes	<p>Developing a WebQuest</p> <p>The facilitator will present the tips offered on slides 15 & 16 to support the youth worker to develop their own WebQuest.</p>	Module Five PowerPoint Slide 14 – 16
1-hour	<p>Create your WebQuest</p> <p>Over the next 1-hour, the group will brainstorm, develop and create a short WebQuest. We suggest that groups of 3 – 4 individuals work together in a Jigsaw Strategy.</p> <p>The groups will</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. identify a topic that would work well with the young people that they are working with, 2. provide a solution to the challenges that they are facing, 3. create an introduction (50-words) 4. create a task (20-words) 5. provide at least 2 different web based resources that will help the young people to tackle the challenge 6. offer one evaluation question. <p>The groups will be asked to present their WebQuest to the group.</p>	Module Five PowerPoint Slide 17 - 18
